

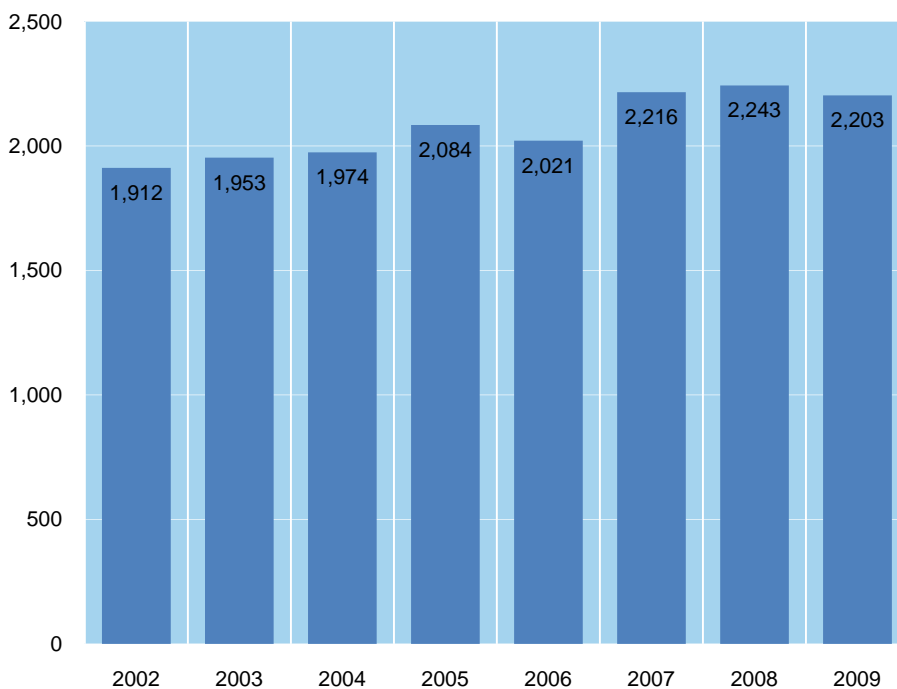

**Table 1. Average Yearly Jail Population; Franklin County Correctional Facilities, 2000-2007**

- The average yearly jail population in Franklin County correction facilities was 2,315 persons in 2007, a decrease of 2.9% from 2006, but 16.8% higher than in 2000.

**Chart 1. Commitments to Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction from Franklin County, 2002-2009**



- Of the 26,165 commitments to Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction (ODRC) facilities in state fiscal year 2009, 8.4% (2,203) were from Franklin County. Commitments to state prisons from Franklin County decreased by 1.8% between 2008 and 2009, but were 15.2% higher than in 2002.
- In state fiscal year 2009, the following were the crimes for which offenders were most frequently committed to state prisons in Ohio: drug possession, 14.0%; trafficking in drugs, 11.4%; theft, 7.6%; burglary, 7.6%; robbery, 4.2%; and receiving stolen property, 4.1%.

## About the Data

### Data Sources:

- Franklin County Sheriff's Office, 2000-2007 Annual Reports (average yearly jail population)
- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, Fiscal Year 2002-2009 Commitment Reports (annual commitments to the state prison system)

### Definitions:

- **Average yearly jail population:** The average yearly jail population is an average point-in-time population count calculated using monthly population data.
- **State fiscal year:** The State of Ohio fiscal year is July 1-June 30.

### Explanations and Caveats:

- The Franklin County Sheriff's Office operates two correctional facilities. Franklin County Corrections Center I is a 643-bed maximum-security facility. Approximately 90% of FCCC-I's population are felons. Franklin County Corrections Center II is a 1,688-bed minimum/medium security facility. Approximately 60% of FCCC-II's population are felons.
